F	For clubs and organisations
	You understand the potential safety risks when children, young people and adults at risk are using changing rooms.
	There is a policy outlining the requirements for appropriate and safe behaviour around changing rooms.
	There are safe practice guidelines for everyone to follow when supervising or sharing changing rooms with children, young people or adults at risk.
	Everyone, including visitors, are informed about, and understand the policies and guidelines for changing rooms.
	Children, young people and adults at risk are encouraged to tell an adult they trust if something makes them feel uncomfortable in or around a changing room.
	There are processes for educating and training people who work with children about changing room safety
	You have safe practices guidelines that cover:
	$\Box$ requirements for the supervision of children, young people and adults at risk
	safe and appropriate behaviours of everyone within and around changing rooms
	the reporting process for concerns around changing rooms; this includes who to contact.
F	For those supervising or sharing changing rooms
	You have read and understand the policies and guidelines for changing rooms.
